

List of available plant species for multi species mixes.

<p>Arrotas Arrow Clover</p> 	<p>Annual legume with an enhanced deep tap root, able to utilise subsoil moisture well into summer</p>
<p>Buckwheat</p> 	<p>Buckwheat is an annual that grows very quickly. It is not frost hardy but is good at scavenging phosphate from the soil. It is a weed suppressor, but not a nitrogen fixer.</p>
<p>Chicory</p> 	<p>Chicory is a very popular, deep rooting species. It is commonly used as an addition to grazing leys due to its high protein content and its ability to fatten lambs. It is also very deep rooting, suiting dry soils and is frequently used in combination with other species</p>
<p>Crimson Clover</p> 	<p>Annual legume. N Fixer</p>
<p>Hairy Vetch</p> 	<p>Hairy vetch is an annual plant which is most commonly used as a green manure. It is noted for good winter hardiness</p>
<p>Hytas Clover</p> 	<p>Moderate winter activity, highly active early spring. Produces large bulk quality feed.</p>

<p>Linseed</p> 	<p>Linseed fits well into crop rotations, being particularly useful as a break crop for cereal production. If kept free of grass weeds it will help control or reduce soil borne cereal root diseases such as take-all</p>
<p>Lotus Corniculatus</p> 	<p>Lotus Corniculatus also known as Birdsfoot trefoil is a perennial, similar to Lucerne. It grows from a basal crown, with numerous stems that can vary from prostrate to erect in growth habit.</p>
<p>Millet</p> 	<p>Milletts are a group of highly variable small-seeded grasses, widely grown around the world as cereal crops or grains for fodder and human food. Requires a soil temperature of 17 degrees.</p>
<p>Mustard</p> 	<p>Excellent for weed seed control and cleaning up some harmful soil fungi. Very fast growing and prefers moist soil</p>
<p>Persian Clover</p> 	<p>An annual for short term use. Will grow well on slightly acidic and clay soils. Best used in mixtures with grass. N Fixer.</p>
<p>Phacelia</p> 	<p>Fast to establish summer cover. Large root mass to improve soil. A favourite for insects due to its high nectar output.</p>
<p>Sheeps Burnet</p> 	<p>Burnet is a perennial forage herb which is commonly mixed with other species to increase diversity and lift trace elements from deep within the soil profile</p>

<p>Sorghum</p> 	<p>An excellent windbreak around other crops, it is an annual crop with similar properties to maize. Requires a very warm soil temperature.</p>
<p>Sunflower</p> 	<p>Standard sunflower can reach 2 metres +. Sunflowers are used to attract the bees.</p>
<p>Tillage Radish</p> 	<p>A deep rooting plant which extracts nutrients from deep in the profile and helps open channels in the soil for subsequent crops. Improves water movement and drainage and increases airflow through the soil.</p>
<p>Vetch</p> 	<p>Vetch is a winter-hardy annual which can be grown on its own to fix large amounts of N, or with rye for the protection of soils over the winter. Vetch makes good silage and is often mixed with oats.</p>
<p>Yarrow</p> 	<p>Yarrow is a small seeded forage herb which is commonly mixed with other species to increase diversity and lift trace elements from deep in the soil profile. It can be mixed with regular grassland crops to increase grazing quality</p>
<p>Yorkshire Fog</p> 	<p>Yorkshire Fog tolerates wet, infertile and acidic soil types and because of this has been used for forestry and erosion control and on high country sheep farms. As a pasture grass Yorkshire Fog has a low dry matter yield but its young shoots are highly digestible readily eaten by stock</p>
